Parish Council

The Parish Council are pleased to announce that Friston has been selected as part of a new initiative called Reclaim the Rain from the Environment Agency, Norfolk County Council and Suffolk County Council to pioneer new ways of building water resilience. Our village was one of six chosen from over 40 sites that applied across Norfolk and Suffolk. Many thanks to Cllr Shipman who impressed the project team with her knowledge and enthusiasm which helped Friston rise above the other applications. The Reclaim the Rain team will be attending our next meeting on the 18th July in the Village Hall. This will be a chance for residents to learn more about the project and what's involved.

Welcome to our newest Councillor, Paul Carlaw. He was co-opted at the last meeting and now means Friston has a full contingent of Councillors.

The Quiet Lanes sign positions have been approved on Grove Rd and Church Rd/Lane. Highways will now fit the posts and the Parish Council will fit the signs. A reminder that this does not change the policing of these roads but asks that motorised road users be mindful that they share these routes with walkers, cyclists and horse riders. In conjunction with this the Parish Council would like to remind dog walkers to please pick up after their dogs and use the dog bins provided. Let's keep Friston nice for everyone to use.

Please be aware Scottish Power Renewables will be conducting 'walkover surveys' at the planned substation site and along the cable route over the coming week. Landowner permission for access has been granted for this.

SASES Update

SASES have commenced judicial review proceedings against the Secretary of State for the Department of Business Energy and Industrial Strategy, currently Kwasi Kwarteng, in respect of his decisions to grant development consent for Scottish Power's proposed EA1N & EA2 wind farm projects. The grounds on which SASES is seeking judicial review only relate to the onshore part of these projects. The grounds relate to the following matters:

Flood risk, Noise impacts, Heritage impacts, Cumulative impact, Failure to adequately consider alternative sites, The absence of a commitment that EA1N will generate 800MW and EA2 will generate 900MW of renewable energy.

The Secretary of State has filed its defence as has Scottish Power as an interested party. SASES has submitted a short reply to those defences. As part of the judicial review procedure the case will now be referred to a judge to decide whether it should be permitted to go ahead. SASES strongly supports offshore wind and has only taken this action due to the deep flaws in the onshore aspects of these projects and the associated decision making. Friston Allotment Association

Courgettes and runner beans will need regular picking from now on to encourage more flowers to maintain cropping throughout the summer. Spring planted garlic can be lifted when leaves start to die back and left on top of soil to dry. Keep a close lookout for side-shoots on tomatoes and remove regularly and feed with tomato fertiliser once a week. New growth on gooseberries can be reduced by half to let in light and make picking easier
