Friston Allotment Association We currently have three allotment plots vacant. If you would like to rent an allotment please contact the Parish Clerk (contact details above) for further details.

Runner and dwarf beans along with sweetcorn can be sown now, indoors, for planting out at the end of May or sown direct outdoors from mid-May. Sow Brussels sprouts and purple sprouting broccoli for harvesting next winter. Continue successive sowings of lettuce, radish and salad crops in short rows for a regular supply. Keep harvesting asparagus until the end of May. Protect strawberries with nets to keep safe from hungry birds. Lift and divide large clumps of daffodils and other spring flowering bulbs. Be ready to water newly planted trees and shrubs when there is a dry spell. Alan.

Energy Projects - Updates A comprehensive update on the current position with all Energy Projects has been placed on the Parish Council's website for residents information. <u>The Parish Council would welcome</u> <u>residents' observations and feedback on the locations and methods of the current infiltration testing by SPR as these may be critical to the flood risk to the village.</u>

<u>SASES</u> - SASES has applied for permission to appeal to the Supreme Court. A decision on permission is awaited but it is hoped this will be before August.

<u>SEAS</u> - SEAS has lost its appeal in the Court of Appeal and is seeking permission to appeal to the Supreme Court. Seas continues to campaign and argue for a better alternative and engages with neighbouring communities.

<u>SPR</u> - SPR met with the PC in late March, principally because it wishes to carry out what are known as "infiltration tests" at the substation site and along the cable route. These tests are primarily designed to see how much surface water can be absorbed into the ground rather having to be discharged through the village. The tests will be carried out from mid-April and therefore contractors and some plant and machinery will be seen at the substation site. See main update for information on the PCs serious concerns about flood risk to the village, Public Rights of Way and diversions.

<u>Lionlink</u> - National Grid has reported back on its non-statutory consultation and announced that landfall for this project will be either at Walberswick or just north of Southwold. The cable route will then make its way to the proposed converter station site at Saxmundham and from Saxmundham the cable route will go to the National Grid connection hub at Friston. Please see main update for the PCs comprehensive response to the Planning Inspectorate's scoping report and the cumulative impact on the health and well-being of the villagers, as well as flood risk.

<u>National Grid's Study</u> into its transmission infrastructure in East Anglia and this has now been published. In short the results of the study are a disaster for this community. **Please see main update on the website.**
